

“What You Should Know During A Snow Storm”

Franklin Township Road personnel work hard to ensure that township roads are safe for residents to travel on. However, we cannot do this alone. Township equipment is big and requires extra space to be effective on the streets and cul-de-sacs. We kindly ask that during periods of snow fall, you do not park on the streets. While we make every effort to clean each and every street, if cars are parked on your road there is the possibility that it will not get plowed and salted. A snow emergency is automatically declared any time there is more than 2” of snow on the ground. During a snow emergency it is imperative that the roadways be cleared for the snow removal equipment to get through, vehicles on the roadway may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner’s expense.

Township snow plows throw the snow to the right and it is impossible to keep from blocking some driveways. We understand this can be frustrating and we recommend that you wait until snow plows have passed before clearing your driveway.

It is the policy of the Board of Trustees of Franklin Township to maintain a policy for storm damage. Although undesired, there is always a potential for damage to mailboxes and fences during the snow removal process. Damage will be evaluated on a case by case basis. Mailboxes and fences that are damaged by actual physical contact with the Township equipment will be repaired at the Township’s expense, but only if they were properly located and installed. The mail box owner is responsible for repair or replacement of the mailbox if the mailbox was damaged by the pressure of the plowed snow and there was no physical contact with the plow equipment.
